Shirley Temple

Shirley Temple was born in Santa Monica, California, on April 23, 1928. She began her career as a child actress at the age of three, and quickly became one of the most popular stars in Hollywood.

Foster continues to act, and has recently starred in films such as *Elysium* (2013) and *Hotel Artemis* (2018).

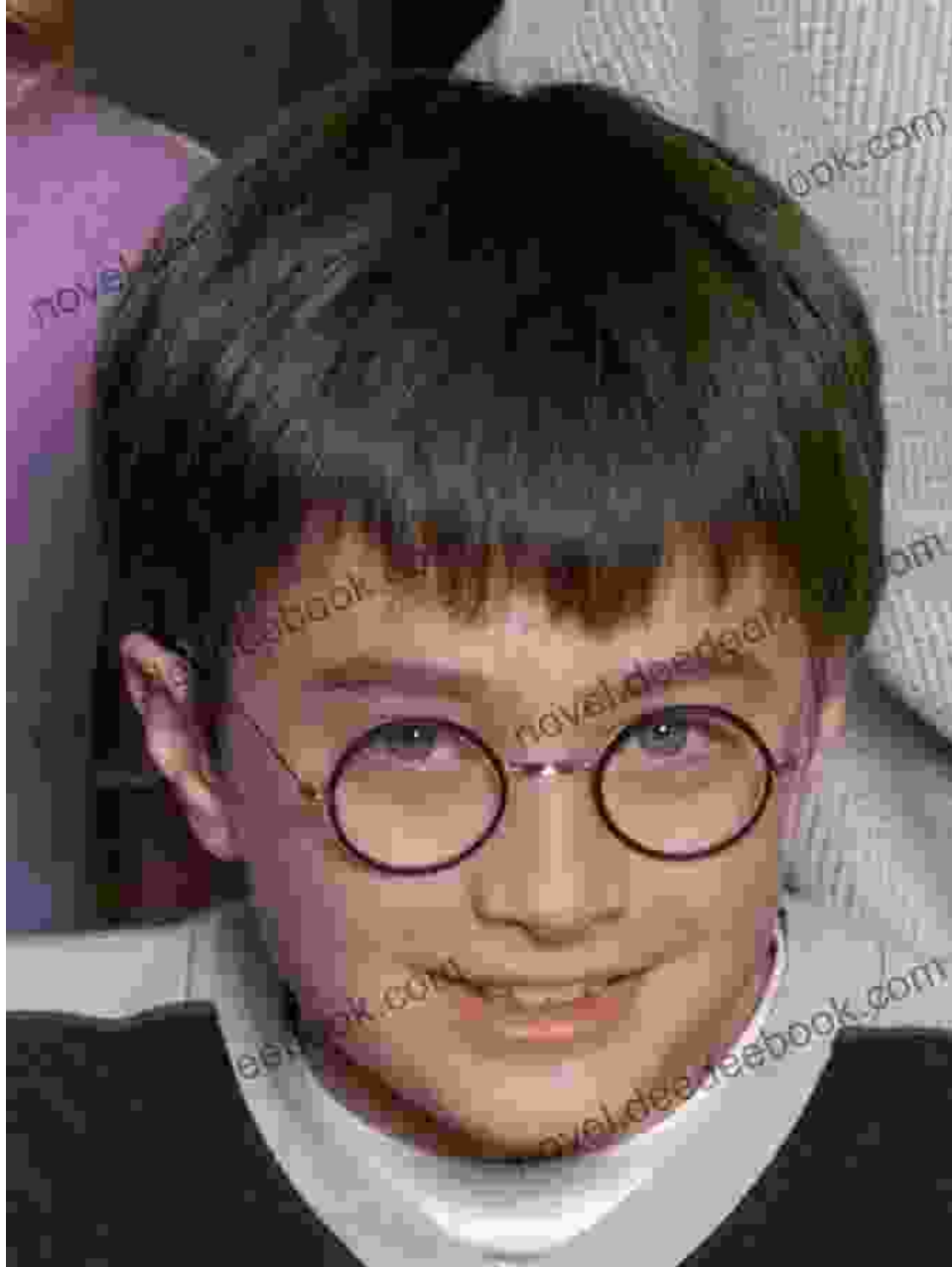


Drew Barrymore

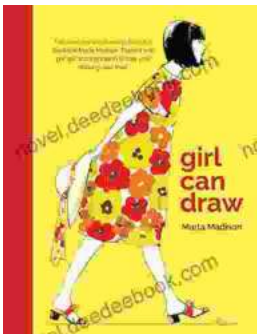
