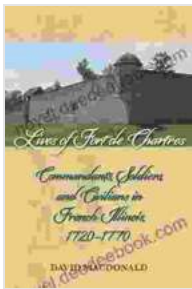


# Commandants, Soldiers, and Civilians in French Illinois, 1720-1770: A History of Shawnee Books

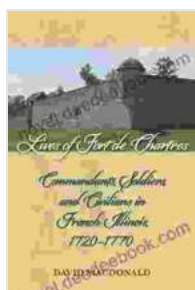
