Yet, most successful artists readily admit to the wisdom of actually blocking in their compositions with a pencil to the component parts and detail. Since a floral arrangement is no exception, this best to first think in terms of basic shapes within the large compositional boundary. The right angle may transform a shape of into a circle (see sketches).



2. Add the Details

Once you have the basic shape, you can begin adding the details. This includes the petals, sepals, and other features of the flower.



3. Shade and Highlight

Once you have the basic outline, you can begin shading and highlighting the flower. This will help you create a sense of depth and realism.



4. Finish Up

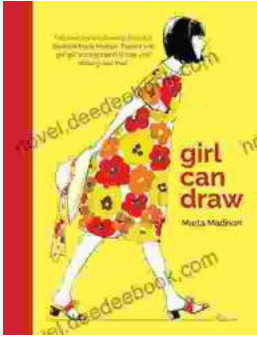
