

Vestibular Migraine: Team Kindol's Groundbreaking Research and Patient Support

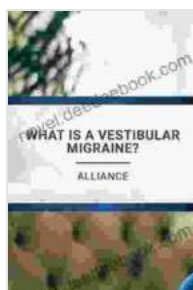
